CURRENT & PAST ROLES IN THE INDEPENDENT SECTOR

I have admission privileges at The BMI Alexandra Hospital Cheadle and treat private patients and NHS patients referred to the independent sector. My main subspecialty interests are adult elective lower limb surgery of the hip and knee.

I take instructions from Clinical Negligence solicitors to help defend clinical negligence claims against NHS Trusts. I produce approximately 50 reports per annum

I am the immediate past Chairman of the MAC (Medical Advisory Committee) of The Alexandra Hospital. Prior to my appointment as Chairman, I was the Orthopaedic Representative of the MAC and held the position since 1999. The position involved chairing bimonthly Clinical Governance meetings relating to clinical governance issues within the hospital. I worked closely with the Executive Team to advise on matters of clinical governance and in particular issues related to the behaviour of doctors practicing at the hospital. I introduced a series of rolling educational lectures including talks from The Information Commissioner, a Coroner, airline pilots relating to Human Factors, and solicitors practicing in clinical negligence.

NHS CONSULTANT APPOINTMENT 1995 - 2020

I was employed as a Consultant Orthopaedic Surgeon at Manchester Royal Infirmary and Honorary Clinical Lecturer in Orthopaedic Surgery to The University of Manchester between 1995 and 2020. I retired at the age of 60. I delayed my retirement a few months until the first wave Covid-19 Pandemic had settled.

Manchester Royal Infirmary is a Major Trauma Centre in the Northwest Region and as such receives major trauma referrals from within the region.

I was the Clinical Director for the Department of Trauma and Orthopaedics from February 2006 to February 2009. As such I was responsible for the day-to-day clinical responsibilities within the department and in charge of Clinical Governance.

I provided emergency and elective orthopaedic care for Central Manchester District with 15 other Consultant colleagues.

My NHS position in a teaching hospital involved providing clinical care to patients, teaching of undergraduate medical students, postgraduate medical trainees, nurses, therapists and trauma care to military observers.

I was directly involved in treating the Manchester Arena bombing victims and Covid-19 Pandemic patients.

CLINICAL EXPERIENCE

ADULT and PAEDIATRIC TRAUMA SURGERY

At the outset of my Orthopaedic training, I was a Registrar at The Royal Preston Hospital for a period of 15 months. The Royal Preston Hospital was one of the MTOS centres and also one of the three trauma centres involved in the National Comparator study with Stoke and Hull. The MTOS study demonstrated that Preston was consistently above the national average in the provision of trauma care when compared with major North American trauma centres.

I was an AO Fellow for a period of nine weeks in two of Germany's busiest trauma centres. The Department of Trauma Surgery of the University hospital of Essen received 260 polytrauma patients and the Department of Trauma and Reconstructive Surgery at the Katherinen hospital Stuttgart, 120 polytrauma patients during 1993. During my time at these two overseas centres I was involved in the immediate resuscitation and subsequent operative and post-operative management of these patients. Both of the departmental heads are well respected trauma surgeons with very high standards. Their units are considered to be among the best in Germany which has the best run trauma service in Europe. Professor Schmit-Neuerburg and Professor Holz have been the immediate past presidents of the German Trauma Association, Professor Holz being a member of The AO Executive committee.

During my training within major centres in the UK and Germany, I have gained wide experience in the resuscitation and surgical management of patients with multiple injuries. I am experienced in AO principles of internal fixation. I keep up to date with new techniques and regularly attended the Advanced and Masters AO courses in Davos, Switzerland along with other trauma symposia and courses. I am a certified ATLS provider.

I commenced my Consultant practice with a subspecialty interest in Paediatric Orthopaedics and this interest is reflected in my published clinical research and

presentations. I have been very fortunate to have worked as a Fellow under the supervision of Dr Stephen Tredwell, Paediatric Orthopaedic Surgeon and Head of the Department of Paediatric Orthopaedics at British Columbia Children's Hospital, Vancouver, BC, Canada.

I ceased practicing Paediatric orthopaedics in 2009 when the new Children's hospital opened with a view to continuing my adult practice.

I remained on the Trauma on call rota at Manchester Royal Infirmary until my retirement at the age of 60 in 2020.

LOWER LIMB SURGERY

I trained as a Fellow in Knee Surgery working for two experts in knee surgery who have interests in primary and revision knee arthroplasty, distraction osteoclasia for deformity around the knee, patellar tendon ACL reconstruction, arthroscopically guided tibial plateau elevation for centrally depressed fractures and meniscal suture.

I have a considerable amount of experience in arthroscopic knee surgery and primary hip and knee arthroplasty.

I perform approximately 50 knee replacements and 50 hip replacements per year.

TEACHING

I was a Consultant Orthopaedic Surgeon in a University teaching hospital and as such provide training for undergraduate medical students, postgraduate surgical trainees, and nurses by formal lectures, seminars, and bedside teaching sessions. I have been responsible for arranging the orthopaedic teaching and examinations for undergraduate medical students. I have chaired lectures on the Regional postgraduate training program.

I enjoyed teaching and feel that extra time should be devoted to teaching medical students in dedicated outpatient clinics and that a properly structured teaching program directly provided by senior medical staff should be provided in each department.
